# **Book Sharing Ideas for Parents**

### **BEFORE READING**

## **Choose the right book**

- Match the length of the book to children's attention
- If your child doesn't enjoy reading yet, try
  - A book that is really a song
  - A short book with one line a page
  - Make a book with pictures of things that are pleasurable to the child
  - A book that has touching places
  - A book that makes sounds (Be careful not to choose a long one)
- Check to see if it has good pictures
- Match your language with what your child can understand
- Choose books that reflect children's special interests or experiences

#### Make it routine

- Make shared book reading (or read-alouds) part of a routine.
- Many parents find before bed time a good time.
- You may want to add more reading times.
- Have a "special" reading place
- Use routine words in a sing song manner such as "Turn the page."

## Focus on prediction

- Look at the cover, model "I bet this is a book about \_\_\_\_." Then ask the child what the book is about when looking at the cover picture.
- When the child is sitting through a whole book, help them make predictions from the pictures about what the story concerns or what may happen next. Use words like "I wonder what is next."

### **DURING READING**

### Make it motivating

- Relate book content to children's interests and experiences.
   "This is just like the Nemo movie." Be careful not to talk so much that the rhythm of the book is lost. A comment of question every couple of pages is usually good.
- Be positive and reinforcing. Smile, use excited tones to your voice.
- If the child, doesn't want to read, flip to end. Say "Just one more page. The End." Then let them get down.

## **Teach vocabulary**

- Select one to three new word meanings and tell the child what they mean in a child-friendly way as the words come up.
- Focus on basic comprehension along with connecting the word with children's previous experiences.
- Try and use words in your everyday life. Select experiences such as field trips, toys, or movies that highlight new words.

## Use a variety of prompting during reading

- Ask who, what, when, where questions when reading if your child is at the point that he/she enjoys the book.
- Use the flashlight to make it more fun. This also encourages joint attention (You can also hide book related pictures and go for a hunt for them with the flashlight.)
- Ask questions that connect with child's previous experiences

## **Gradually increase participation**

• Let individual children do more talking and take more responsibility for comprehending the book as their experience and knowledge grows.

## **Adjust the balance of conversation**

- Adults should do more talking when concepts or words are new.
- Children should do more talking when they have already mastered the concepts or are familiar with the book

### **AFTER READING**

### **Confirm predictions**

• Talk about what children predicted earlier and confirm or alter the prediction

## **Encourage retellings and use of new meanings**

- Help children use the book to tell you or others the story using the new vocabulary words.
- Follow-up with the new vocabulary words so that children will apply them to other situations outside of book sharing

## Talk about future plans

- Talk about what books you would like to read next time
- Take children to library to choose new books
- Talk about future experiences that relate to the book's content

### **Predictable Books\***

Predictable books use repetitive language and/or sequences, rhythms, and rhymes. Predictable books allow early readers to predict what the sentences are going to say, thereby increasing enjoyment and helping to build vocabulary and memory skills.

## There are various types of predictable books:

**Chain or Circular Story:** The story's ending leads back to the beginning.

**Cumulative Sequence:** The story builds on a pattern. It starts with one person, place, thing, or event. Each time a new person, place, thing, or event is shown, all the previous ones are repeated. Example: *The Gingerbread Man.* 

**Familiar or Known Sequence:** A common, recognizable theme such as the days of the week, the months, etc. Example: *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle.

**Pattern Stories:** The scenes or episodes are repeated with a variation.

**Question and Answer:** A question is repeated throughout the story. Example: *Brown Bear, Brown, Bear, What Do You See?* by Bill Martin, Jr.

**Repetition of Phrase/Sentence:** As its name implies, a phrase or sentence is repeated.

**Repetition of Rhymes/Rhythms:** A rhyme, refrain, or rhythm is repeated throughout the story.

**Songs:** Familiar songs with repeated phrases, sentences, rhymes, or refrains.
