Athletic Eligibility

To participate in Athletics, students/ athletes must be currently enrolled in at least 20 semester units of work and passed at least 20 semester units of work at the completion of the previous grading period and must have maintained a 2.0 grade point average in all enrolled courses on a 4.0 scale with no more than one "F" grade (C.I.F. rule 204).

Probation Period: (only for students who meet the above requirements, but have not maintained a 2.0 G.P.A.) The student will be allowed one probation period in the 9th or 10th grade and one probation period in the 11th or 12th grade; a total of two during their high school years. The principal or their designee will oversee probation at each school site. These students must meet the required standards by the end of the probationary period in order to remain eligible (C.I.F. rule 204).

Student athletes and spirit leaders are also required to have the following:



- 1. Complete physical examination.
- 2. Proper insurance coverage. Insurance can be purchased at the Student Bank for those not having adequate, private insurance.
- 3. A signed Parental Consent Card. Such cards can be obtained at the Student Bank as well as from each sport's respective coach.
- 4. Pay a \$30.00 participation fee. Students will receive an ASB card from this fee.

Miscellaneous But Very Important Information

Buy an ASB Card & Save!

With an ASB card students receive a discount on the purchase of their yearbook and discounted admission to <u>ALL Athletic Events and all Dances</u>. Without an ASB card General Admission to all games is \$5.00 YOU SAVE OVER \$25.00 JUST on games. \$10 in September can save you over \$100 during the school year!!!

<u>DANCES</u>—8 p.m. - 10:30 p.m., doors close at 9:30 p.m., Admission varies but 25% savings on all pre-sale tickets with ASB card. Only Yerba Buena students with identification will be allowed to purchase tickets at the door. Students wishing to bring a guest from another school may do so ONLY by purchasing tickets in advance (one guest per student) and complete a Yerba Buena guest pass.

<u>P.E. UNIFORMS</u>—All students are required to wear uniforms to participate in P.E. classes. Uniforms are on sale at the school bank.

GRADES/HOMEWORK—If you need to check on grades, get homework when you are absent, or get ideas on how to get help, call a Counselor at 408.347.4721. You can get information about Weekly Grade Checks, Tutoring College Opportunities, and Family/Parent Workshops.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES/BANK—Call 408.347.4732 for information about student leadership opportunities, student government, class positions, clubs, dances and special events.

<u>ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES</u>—Call 408.928.9300 for information about night school after 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

<u>LOCKERS</u>—Lockers are provided to students strictly as a convenience. Yerba Buena High School and the East Side Union High School District are not responsible for loss or damage of the contents of a locker from any cause. Students are encouraged NOT TO place any item of value in their lockers. Students are responsible for the loss or damage of any school property, including textbooks, library books, P.E. clothes, band uniforms and school purchased musical instruments. Students are not required to obtain a locker and there may not be one available for every student.



Tobacco/Smoking Update for Youth

It is a violation for a minor to be in possession of tobacco products according to Section 308 (b) of the California Penal Code. The law allows any law enforcement officer to cite a person under the age of 18 years for being in possession of any tobacco products or paraphernalia. If a student is cited for tobacco use or possession The County of Santa Clara Juvenile Probation Department's Juvenile Diversion Unit will notify them of two choices:

1. MANDATORY Counseling Program for one (1) day at Breathe California located at 1469 Park Avenue, San Jose, CA 95126 (Regardless of your child's participation in a tobacco program

• <u>A fifty dollar (\$50.00) fee is charged.</u>

through his/her school).

- This includes a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) non-refundable registration fee that must be paid in advance to enroll in the program and to guarantee seating.
- Parents are REQUIRED to attend the first hour and a half (1-1/2) of the program. Failure to appear will result in loss of the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) registration fee.

Or

- 2. A Hearing with a Juvenile Traffic Officer can assign the following to a minor:
- A seventy-five dollar (\$75.00) fine
- A Penalty Assessment of one hundred thirty-six dollars (\$136.00) for a total of two hundred eleven dollars (\$211.00)
- <u>Completion of 30 hours community</u> service.

Appropriate Dress For Appropriate Success

The appearance of students while at school has a direct impact on behavior and learning. For this reason, the following standards for student dress have been established.

The following "Appropriate Dress For Appropriate Success" dress requirements applies to all students unless a waiver has been obtained. Students must come to school each day in the "Appropriate Dress For Appropriate Success" theme that has been established by students, parents, and staff at Yerba Buena High School. Please see the following:

GIRLS:

- SKIRT OR SKORT: Christopher plaid, green or khaki.
- PANTS: Khaki or green.
- POLO/PIQUE: White or green collar.
- SHIRT OR BLOUSE: White or green collar.
- SHORTS: Khaki or green.


BOYS:

- PANTS: Khaki or green.
- POLO/PIQUE: Green or white short sleeve.
- SHIRT: White long sleeve collar.
- SHORTS: Khaki or green.

OTHER ITEMS:

- SCHOOL CLUB ATTIRE (TOPS ONLY): School logo and/or club name; Prior approval required before distribution.
- CARDIGAN SWEATER: Green, white or black.
- V-NECK SWEATER: Green, white or black.
- TURTLE NECK: Green or white cotton.
- JACKETS: Green, white or black (no team jackets).
- SWEATER VEST: Green, white or black.
- SHOES: Closed toe, no sandals, thongs, boots or backless shoes.
- SHOE STRINGS: Black, green or brown. No red or blue laces.
- BACKPACKS: No writing on backpacks (company logo only), black, green or brown.
- BELTS: Black, brown, or white. No logos no initials on belt buckle.
- SOCKS: White, green, black or brown.

Work Permit

All students under the age of 18 must have a work permit in order to be employed. The steps for obtaining a work permit are as follows:

- 1. Secure an application form from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. in the Attendance Office located in Room 206.
- 2. Complete top half of form.
- 3. Have your prospective employer fill out and sign the bottom half of the form.
- 4. Have your parent or guardian sign in the proper location.
- 5. Return the application to the Attendance Office with current Social Security card.

A work permit will be issued within 2 days of the proper completion and return of permit application.

Student Parking

Students may park in the student parking lot under the following conditions:

- Possession of a valid California Driver's License
- 2. Adequate insurance
- 3. Agreement to park in student parking area only



- 4. Car to be left alone during school day
- 5. Student observes laws outlined in California Vehicle Code.

Permission to park in student lot may be revoked by administration for violation of any of the above. Students who violate parking rules may be cited by the San Jose Police Department.

Absent!

The State of California has instituted Senate Bill 727 (Attendance Law). Under this law only students that are in school will count for reimbursement from the state. Because of this new law it is very important for the financial stability of the district that all students be in school. Every student must be in school unless it is necessary for him/her to be absent due to illness, doctor appointment, court subpoena or funeral of member of immediate family. These are the only excusable reasons for a student's absence from school. Family emergencies, out-of-town, etc. are *not excused* absences unless the school has been notified prior to the absence. When possible, all absences should be *cleared in advance* through the Attendance Office. If a student arrives late to school, he/she must report directly to the Attendance Office: if he/she does not, the student will receive "unverified" for all classes missed. All students arriving late must have a note from a parent/guardian. If no parent verification is received, the student will receive an "unverified" for each class missed. Students who must leave campus before the end of the school day must check through the Attendance Office. If they do not, they will receive "unverified" for classes missed. Students who do not follow attendance procedures may be referred for disciplinary action.

Students who are absent must observe the following procedures:

1. CONTACT THE SCHOOL

It is requested that a parent or guardian telephone the school the first day of absence. Contact should be made as early as possible. The purpose of this call is to advise the school of the nature of the absence. Students with a last name A-M should call 408.347.4756 or N-Z 408.347.4758.

2. BRING A NOTE

Please send: (1) Note with your student's name, (2) Dates of absence, (3) Reason, (4) Comments, (5) Parents or guardian signature, (6) Home phone number, (7) current date, and (8) Work phone number.

3. PHONE EVERY THREE DAYS AND CONTACT STUDENT'S ADVISOR

In cases where students are absent for a period of several days, a parent or guardian should call the school every three days and advise the Attendance Office of the condition of the student. The parent or guardian is also encouraged to contact the student's counselor for lesson assignments that have been missed. Following this procedure will prevent the student from falling behind in his/her work.

4. ADVANCE ABSENCES

When the student knows in advance he/she will be absent, he/she should bring a note from home. This note should be cleared by the Attendance Office in advance of the absence. When it is not possible for the student to bring such a written excuse in advance, the parent or guardian must telephone the Attendance Office by 12 noon on the day of the absence. The student must pick up an advance admit before leaving campus, otherwise the absence can not be cleared.
